Training Programme Information

Applicants will not complete preferences at the time of application. Shortlisted applicants will be contacted in March 2026 once programmes are available for preferencing.

THE SELECTION PROCESS

Information in this section relates to applications to Broad Based Training (BBT) CT1 in Scotland only.

To be eligible for a post in BBT, applicants must complete and pass all stages of the General Practice (GP) and Core Psychiatry recruitment process. Applicants do not need to apply directly to GP and Core Psychiatry to be eligible for BBT, although you must apply to each separate vacancy if you wish to be considered for each training programme.

In 2026 recruitment, the GP and Core Psychiatry recruitment and selection process' will involve sitting and passing the Multi-Specialty Recruitment Assessment (MSRA). The pass mark for both papers of the MSRA is 186.

Therefore, the recruitment process for Broad Based Training in Scotland will be as follows:

- All applicants who meet the minimum eligibility criteria and pass longlisting will be invited to sit the MSRA.
- On successful completion of the MSRA, applicants will be invited to attend an online BBT Paediatric interview, in rank order of their MSRA score.
- The interview will consist of a 10-minute Paediatric Clinical Thinking interview with 2 Paediatric assessors, each awarding a score out of 20 (40 marks in total).
- Candidates must achieve 55% pass mark at their BBT Paediatric interview (22/40) to be appointable for BBT.
- If applicant numbers exceed interview capacity, applicants not invited to interview initially will be placed on a reserve list and invited if an interview slot becomes available.

Final ranking will be based on the candidate's performance at the MSRA and the BBT Paediatric interview using the following weightings:

- MSRA 75%
- Interview 25%

Use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) During Interviews

MSRA Additional Information

If you have applied to multiple specialties that use the MSRA you will receive multiple invites to attend however applicants only need to book **one exam appointment**. Applicants only need to sit the exam once and the result from that exam will count toward their application for all specialties they apply to that use the MSRA as part of their selection process.
